Historic Vehicle Use - always remember to carry the following 4 items.

Club Run - carry a "paper, not electronic" copy of the club calendar with the event listed.

Personal Use - fill in your RMS log sheet before you leave - as fines & points apply.

Certificate of Approved Operations (purple A5 sheet issued by the RMS).

FCNSW membership card - to confirm your financial status.

Travel days for FCNSW Regional & Interstate club events – HVS vehicles

The FCNSW holds most of its events in the Sydney area, however members also attend events in regional NSW and interstate, and regional members travel to Sydney to attend major Sydney events.

It is not always possible, practical or even wise to travel to, attend the event and return home during the listed day of the event, as we have aging cars, and in some cases, aging members.

As such, members need to be able to attend regional & major local events under full HVS conditions, traveling immediately before, and returning immediately after the event.

Travel days have always been considered to be part of the event for HVS vehicle use.

Travel days are not considered to be personal use by the FCNSW, they are clearly part of attending the listed club event, specifically,

• regional or interstate events for Sydney members, and

major Sydney events for our regional members.

To confirm this situation for members, the FCNSW calendar will define an appropriate event duration for regional & major events for HVS purposes, which will include any necessary travel days.

These travel days will be either side of the event date and will apply whether members are traveling individually, or as part of an organized convoy. Not everyone will want to, or need to take advantage of these travel days, but the option needs to be available to members, and formally identified in the club calendar.

A regional Sunday event could include the Sat & Mon as travel days.

A full weekend event with overnight stay, could include the Fri & Mon as travel days.

The interstate based FIAT Nationals might require 2-3 days either side for travel, given some older classic vehicles are not capable of being driven continuously at full motorway speeds.

For the FCNSW, these events would typically be,

- NMHD (Berry venue)
- AutoItalia (ACT)
- Extended weekend trips with overnight stays
- Interstate FIAT Nationals

Sydney based Shannon's Sydney Classic, and the annual club Concorso.

The club calendar will include a statement in the event description such as,

"The duration of this event for HVS purposes is (date) to (date), which includes the necessary travel days."

If a member with an HVS vehicle wishes to extend his journey outside the defined HVS event duration, there is no problem, but this use then becomes personal use and the additional days should be entered in the RMS log book.

VALE – THOMAS CHARLES HAY

19/04/1936 - 13/12/2019

Life Member and former President Tom Hay passed away on the 13th of December, aged 83 after many years of battling multiple health issues, which started when he was aged 56 I believe.

My son Glenn and I visited him a few times over the years and I must admit to forgetting the exact ailments and treatments that he endured.

During his time in the club, he served on the Committee for a total of 12 years, starting off as a general committee member in 1984, then moving up to Club Captain the next year and then straight to the President's role for 1986/87, then to Vice President for 1988/89, then back to President for an extended time from 1990 to 1993, then Vice President again in 1994/95. Any role he took on was always done with enthusiasm and with a sense of humour. Not to mention that things were

always done "properly", that probably being because of his profession of an engineer.

As an engineer, he was very keen on his

automobiles and with his son David, he built 3 motorkhana specials, the first being a Fiat 850 Sport that he named "Animale". The next special that he built was a Fiat 127 also called "Animale". He removed the pushrod 903cc engine from the front of the 127 and instead fitted a 1300cc SOHC engine into the back seat region, making it a mid-engined machine. Truth be said, neither of these cars were ever dominant in club motorkhana competition, but Tom had another idea. After seeing home-built "rails" that were competing in NSW and Australian Motorkhana Championships, particularly a certain Mini powered car, he decided he could design and build one that was Fiat powered.

He used an 1100cc Fiat 128 engine and 128 suspension and hubs for the front end. At the back he installed a live axle, but used

motorcycle springs and dampers. Fiat 128 hubs were again used at the rear, but the rear wheels were Mini rims with Fiat centres welded in. No mean feat to do such a thing, but doing things the easy way was not Tom's style. Take for example the "fiddle brakes" on the car. He fitted 2 separate systems to the car, one for each of the front wheels and one for the rear wheels, with two big power boosters for good measure! Each front wheel could be independently braked either by a lever out the side of the car or by using the steering. This worked by individual brake master cylinders for the left and right front wheels which were operated by turning the steering wheel left or right! The brake line system on the car was amazing! There were actually 6 master cylinders in the car. The pedal system used is also worth a mention. When you look under the dash, the pedal arrangement looks normal, but the normal looking brake pedal only works on the 2 rear wheels. In other motorkhana specials I have seen 4 pedals used, but in Tom's rail there wasn't a lot of room down there so another solution was called for. Tom solved it by making the left pedal both a clutch pedal AND a brake pedal, which only braked the front wheels. When the pedal is pressed it acts as a clutch pedal, but at a certain stage of its travel the pedal engages with the brake master cylinder. Complicated for sure... but it works well.

Tom was always very generous to Club Members with his cars, even though his own children David and Melanie drove in motorkhanas, and was only too pleased to offer anyone else a drive in his cars too. I myself used to drive his 127 and the Rail at various times and had a lot of fun. But the thing that will always stay with me concerning Tom is that when my son Glenn was 10 years old, Tom used to sit him on his lap and let Glenn steer the Rail around Ansell Park. One day I was on the other side of the main field when someone said that Glenn was now driving the Rail BY HIMSELF! What the.... I thought! Apparently, Tom saw how well Glenn was taking to steering and decided to show him how to operate the pedals! So that was Glenn's first driving lesson and the instructor bailed out! But we all know how well Glenn has gone as a driver.

In early 2001 Tom had recently had a

heart operation which entailed having the ribs re-attached to the sternum with wire and the doctors told him that they would never heal properly and driving his beloved Rail was out of the

> question. Way too bumpy. The next thing I know is I had a phone call from Tom telling me this information and that he wanted to GIVE the Rail to Glenn as he knew how much Glenn would love the car and look after it. But we would have to buy the trailer it was on as he needed to replace it with a new box trailer! I feel this generosity has been well rewarded with the amount of work that Glenn has put into it over 18 years of ownership, with the Rail even winning the Outright Trophy at the Fiat of Italy Cup 9 times. I can report that Tom was very pleased.

I believe that Tom was also very heavily involved with the Salvation Army and he and wife Leone used to use their converted bus for catering purposes to help out people like volunteer bushfire fighters. On this medium sized bus Tom also used his engineering skills to fit it out as a motorhome. He bought the bus in Queensland and brought it home to fit it out with cupboards, beds, bathroom and lots of mod-coms. They then used it on multiple trips around the country, flat towing a Suzuki Vitara behind it, using Tom's own system for using the Suzuki's brakes when he applied the bus brakes. I inspected the bus shortly after he finished it and I can report that the work was of a very high standard (of course!).

In 1998 Tom was honoured with a Life Membership of the Club. 1998 club President Chris Davis stated in his President's Report in March that "until health problems forced his retirement, Tom was the driving force behind the maintenance of Ansell Park. Both he and his son David stored and maintained the club's Fiat tractor and slasher and were always first on the scene for working bees, always seeming to be doing the most demanding jobs."

In 2004 the club was able to build a shelter shed at Ansell Park and the Committee thought it was fitting to name it the HAY SHED in Tom's honour. This was probably a little whimsical, but deserved nevertheless.

On behalf of the Club, I would like to extend to Leone and Tom's whole family our sincere condolences.

Annual General Meeting of the Council of Motor Clubs held on Tuesday 26th November 2019.

Extracts from the minutes of the meeting;

74 Clubs represented by 96 delegates

President's Report

T. Thompson reported that 2018/19 had been challenging years for the Council in the loss of two valuable and effective office bearers. He urged that Clubs treat as urgent the question of succession planning in their Clubs in view of the predominant age profile of most clubs.

This year had been an eventful one. The Council now has a membership of 188 Affiliated Clubs with perhaps 27,000 members. National Motoring Heritage Day in May continues to grow into a significant National Motoring Event and is strongly supported by the CMC.

Shannons Sydney Classic, our signature event, is beginning to outgrow its venue with in excess of 1800 vehicles on display this year in August. Shannons will be on board in 2020 and will be bringing its "Big Rig" and Jim Richards.

This year we have succeeded in seeing permanent the logbook scheme for the Historic Vehicle Scheme (HVS) and the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS) thanks in no small part to our delegates on the relevant Government Committees. Similar success is

reflected in the growth of the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS) for modified historic vehicles, with registration now above 3,800 up from 2,410 last year. Many are conversions from HVS. The Roadside Advisory Council is on hold. GVM for CVS is 3.5T which is well below the regular light vehicle limit of 4.5T. This is being investigated. It should be noted there is no limit to HVS to cater for heritage trucks.

The President wished to thank the Members of the Management Committee for the work they have put in ensuring the smooth running of the Council.

The President welcomed the new delegates. He then spoke of the recent passing of CMC Vice President, Tony De Luca. He spoke about Tony's involvement with the CMC Committee over a period of more than 20 years. All present were then asked to observe a minute's silence in memory of Tony.

A petition had been sent to the Federal Government re the **luxury car tax on historic vehicles** and on Website. Everyone is urged to complete and send to their local member.

The 2020 Shannons Sydney Classic would be held on Sunday 16th August 2020. The President visited the SMSP site and measured car ports, garages, spaces etc in preparation for planning the layout for 2020. This was necessary in view of changes being made by ARDC on the site. External caterers would not be permitted on the site (as requested by an affiliated Club seeking occupancy of Area E). SMSP lighting program was discussed – they need to be operational by mid-August 2020. The entrance fee would be raised to \$25, to include a \$5 contribution to the Prostate Cancer Foundation in lieu of the raffle. Tony O'Donnell had accepted the role of organizing the 2020 event.

A telephone conference was held last Sunday 24th November for the recent AHMF meeting. It discussed the planned Festival in Albury for March/April 2020 and the lower than expected bookings. Next AHMF Annual Meeting would be held in ACT and following that in NSW in 2021.

It had been decided that **CMC would not be involved in directly organizing the different events for NMHD** but would leave it to individual clubs and Groups. CMC would offer every assistance in publicizing and a NMHD Coordinator may be

appointed to gather information from all venues together with hosting clubs, contact details etc.

The Robert Shannon Foundation was again offering grants to young people (less than 30 years old) to assist them in pursuing automotive projects including restoration of a car, writing or researching a paper on historic motoring etc.

Applications must be made through a CMC Affiliated Club and forwarded to CMC, which would then consider them and pass on to AHMF.

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

Congratulations must go again to Nik Prieston for coming third outright in the point score and first on handicap in the Classic Class of the Targa Championship. Nik had competed all year and achieved some very good wins and placings. Also, Phil Buggee achieved 16th outright in the same class as Nik, which included a total of 56 pointscorers for the syear.

David Currow did very well in the thoroughbred class taking 2nd in the championship with his 124. Jack Waldron from Victoria were the winners of the Thoroughbred championship.

The **Fiat Club's membership has soared in recent years** after Fiat re-entered the Australian market in 2006 and also because of the more favourable terms for vehicles on the Historic Vehicle Registration Scheme (HVS). Looking at the membership data a number of members own one of the newer Fiats sold after their comeback in 2006, although, the Abarth badge has been the more prominent purchase. There are 17 Abarth 500s and 2 Abarth 124 Spiders in the Club. Puntos number 7, Modern 500s and Ritmos 4 each. There are two each of the 500X and the Freemont SUV.

In the older car bracket there many cars from Fiat's "golden era" in Australia from the late 1950s to the 1970s that club members own. The most popular is the **Fiat 124** - Coupes, Spiders and a few sedans numbering around 50. They are closely followed by the **original 500** and there are about 30 **X1/9s**. Yes, there are close to 100 of these cars in the club?

The most popular sedan is the 131 with over a dozen of these plus a good number od 850s and 600s. There are even 6 or so 2300s, however, we seen to be short of the 1100, 1500 and the wonderful 125. Sadly, there are no 130s on the list this time.

NEWS

2019 Vehicles sales for Australia have been published showing a decline in total sales of over 90,000 to 1,062,867 new vehicles. Sales fell across all states and for most brands. Those brands that managed to increase sales included Kia, BMW, Lexus, Volvo, Skoda and Porsche. Chinese car brands, which include MG, LDV, Haval, and Great Wall also increased sales over the year.

Distribution of market shares over the three main segments were SUVs - 45.5 % market share, Passenger cars - 29.7% and Light Commercials - 21.2%.

Toyota topped the sales chart followed by Mazda second and Hyundai third. Details of the top 20 models sold as well as sales by brand are included in the tables below.

Sales of Fiats dropped about 430 units, or 17.4 % to 2,053 vehicles. The Fiat 500 once again was the second highest seller in the "Micro" car segment with 673 cars but was well behind the class leader, the Kia Picanto, with sales of 5,237.

The Back End

The Power Calculator...

The power calculator is a table used to estimate the gains in horsepower achieved after certain engine and ancillary modifications are made. The example below dates from the mid fifties and is intended as a guide only, however, it makes interesting reading as to how much more horsepower can be gained from the modifications made. Has any club member seen or used these in days gone by. Is it reasonable accurate. Email or call the Editor and let him know your thoughts...

POWER CALCULATOR INSTRUCTIONS

The figures shown in the chart are, of necessity, approximate and are intended as a GUIDE only. You may get more or less than the exact increases shown. The percentage of power increase will vary with the make and type of engine and will also vary with each COMBINATION of special equipment used.

EXAMPLE: We show a 3/4 Comsouth as giving an increase of 10%, and a Dual Container Manifold on increase of 15%. Yet when used together, an increase of more than 30% is usually developed. Each whom variations in lower output and performance are often pated.

The figures assume the use of a satisfactory ignition system, such as a Mallory MagSpark or a Spalding Dual Coll, and also that a suitable exhaust system or headers are being used. Performance increases are shown sovering only a few of the hundreds of Special Auto Parts available . . . and it should be remembered that practically all of them are designed to increase power, speed, or mileage.

The importance of good ignition is familiar to anyone who has ever experienced high speed "miss" or "cutour", while the importance of proper exhaust scaveraging is evidenced by dynamometer tests showing that the re-installation of the stock exhaust system or a moderately modified engine (50% increase over stock), cut the HP to the rear wheels by 28%

Most SPECIAL AUTO PARTS can be classed as bonus items, as they not only RAISE HP, but also INCREASE MILEAGE. Of course, SPEED increases are usually evident with any special equipment installed.
