Please take note of the following message from the Club Registrar, Richard Dalziel.

Dear Members with cars on historic registration,

Service NSW has confirmed that HVS registrations are not considered to be "essential", so we have to wait until after lockdown ends on 28 Aug to process our renewals in person.

We already have 3 months from the time our registrations expire until they are cancelled, so that should be enough time (one would hope!) to allow us to attend a centre after lockdown.

Obviously you can't drive your car after the registration expires.

# The Depot Motor Museum – Deniliquin

Earlier this year, at a time where travel was not so restricted, I had a country wedding to attend in Southern NSW. As this was going to be a few days away from home, I searched on the web for places of interest that could be worth visiting on the trip back home and found that a motor museum had recently opened up in Deniliquin.

Set up by the Purtill family, who had been operating a transport

It wasn't too had to find 'The Depot' and on entering the front door I was pleased to see that they had about eight or nine small cars on display, including a 1957/8 FIAT 500, N model (though they listed it as a 1962 D model). The information card for the 500

house their collection of vehicles, motoring memorabilia and general artefacts that they had collected over the past seventy years.

The building has two large display halls for the car and truck collection, a mezzanine for

### Fiat 500 line-up rejigged again can be added on the hatch for \$1500.

Flagship Dolcevita now a permanent member of ageing Italian city car range.

Fiat has rejigged its city car line-up in Australia yet again, adding the specialedition Dolcevita as a full-time member of the range.

With the current model dating back to 2008 in Australia, but receiving a significant facelift in 2016, the 500 soldiers on as Fiat's local outpost continues to hold out on offering the new-generation electric version available overseas.

The latest revision to the 2021 Fiat 500 range sees the Dolcevita nameplate given permanent residence, starting at \$21,450 plus on-road costs for the three-door hatch with a fivespeed manual gearbox.

A five-speed 'Dualogic' auto transmission adds \$2000, while a softtop cabriolet version is available with both gearbox options for \$4000 over the

The Fiat 500 Lounge continues as the entry model, but now only as a hatch, priced from \$18,950 plus on-road costs for the manual and with auto adding \$2000.

The auto-only Club variant that previously topped the range (from \$23,250) is no longer available.

As before, every MY21 Fiat 500 model comes powered by a 1.2-litre fourcylinder petrol engine, which produces 51kW of power and 102Nm of torque. Combined fuel consumption is claimed to be 4.8L/100km with the auto, or 4.9L/100km with the manual.

Dolcevita variants feature 16-inch alloys, a body-coloured dash, premium cloth upholstery, automatic climate control, cruise control, chrome exterior detailing, fog lights, dusk and rain sensors and, on hatch models, a fixedglass sunroof.

There's also 'Dolcevita' badging on the front guards, while an electric sunroof

Other options on the Dolcevita include metallic or pastel paint (\$550) and a Lusso pack which adds leather seats. tinted windows and a different 16-inch wheel design, for \$1900.

Standard equipment at Lounge level includes 15-inch alloy wheels, LED daytime running lights (DRLs), tyre pressure monitoring, rear parking sensors, a 7.0-inch touch-screen, Apple CarPlay/Android Auto, digital radio and a 3.5-inch instrument display.

Lounge variants also come finished in a new and exclusive 'Sicilian Orange' exterior colour, along with a navy 'Techno' blue interior, which includes a matte-finish dash and matching blue seats stamped with a 'Fiat' monogram.

Other gear included on the most affordable Fiat 500 includes heated and power-adjustable side mirrors, voice control, a leather-wrapped steering wheel and speed limiter function.

If you don't want an orange Fiat 500 Lounge, pastel paint can be added for an additional \$550.

Cheeky looks, compact dimensions, an upmarket interior and advanced infotainment all play a part in the little Latin machine's success, but it's the smooth and efficient electric powertrain that helps lift the 500 above its

competition in the city car class, which is increasingly turning towards full electrification.

Like its predecessor, the new Fiat 500 Electric looks the part, its cute and curvaceous lines paying tribute to the iconic fifties original, while inside the design and finish have taken a massive leap forward. Top-notch materials and a slick infotainment set-up that includes the option of a large 10.25-inch touchscreen help deliver real premium appeal, while even entry-level models come loaded with standard kit. However, at the heart of the car's appeal are its all-new electrified underpinnings, with both the 91bhp and 116bhp options delivering smooth and instant acceleration that gives this compact city car impressive performance for such a small vehicle. In combination with the simple singlespeed automatic transmission, light steering and those pert proportions, it makes the 500 perfect for the cut-andthrust of the urban jungle. Yet the refined and comfortable Fiat will happily go further afield, especially with the larger 42kWh battery, which increases the range from 115 to 199 miles. Better still, rapid-charging capability of up to 85kW means the battery can be topped up to 80 per cent in as little as 30 minutes.

The icing on the cake is the fact that, despite its upmarket image and cuttingedge tech, the new 500 hasn't forgotten its value-for-money roots. Not only will it cost peanuts to run, it's also surprisingly affordable to buy, with prices starting from just £20,495, including the Government's £2,500 Plug -in Car Grant.

The entry-level version of the all-electric 500 is incredibly tempting value, but it misses out on the flexibility of the larger battery, and some key equipment. With Fiat currently offering a £1,000 discount across the entire range, we'd go for Icon trim; a three-year PCP agreement with a £3,000 deposit translates to £295 per


