## **2021 NSW Hillclimb Championship Wrap Up** (Michael McGeorge and Martin Gallard compete in their highly modified 127s)

After all the delays of 2020, the 2021 NSW Hillclimb Championship was shaping up to be a great return to action. A nine round calendar was published, seeing competitors travel to Bathurst for two rounds, Huntley, Kempsey, Grafton, Tamworth, Ringwood, Gunnedah and ACT for the final round. This would be followed by the Australian Championship, which would be held in QLD in November.

Rounds 1 & 2 are always a great start to the championship. Not only is Bathurst every drivers dream, but it's also a great family weekend away. We take the whole crew for a spot of camping, mixed with some motorsport during the day. What a combo!

Round 1 on Saturday see's competitors run the track backwards up through the Esses. A couple of spots where you need to take your brave pills, but getting a perfect start is more important as its immediately into the hill. It was a very disrupted day with long delays from timing issues and oil down on track.

As always it was a tight battle, but 37.42 vs 37.61 saw the Orange beast take the win for round 1. First blood to Mic.

Round 2 on Sunday see's competitors tackle the track in the correct direction, starting on Mountain Straight right up to McPhillamy Park. This run is a lot faster, mixed with a couple of spots that really challenge you to keep the right foot planted. It was another disrupted day with more timing issues, and a lengthy period of waiting whilst another event based down at the pits did a two lap formation parade around the whole circuit at walking pace. Just what you need to make finding your rhythm a little bit harder.

The grey goose was able to strike back, with 67.54 over Mics 69.15. Nothing in these battles, it's just how Mic & I like it, now with one win each.

With a month's rest under our belts, round three saw us in Mics backyard for the Huntley hillclimb. A home advantage for the orange team?

Something about this event has always seen my car off the pace, the specs of my car always meant I was going to be chasing Mic hard. The first two runs were where I thought I would be, so I threw some lighter tyres and rims on the car to see if it would make a difference. The difference was good enough to get me right back in the mix, chasing Mic all the way to the final run of the day. It

was a cracker of a run, both of us putting down a PB in the heat of the battle. My run of 34.99 was a great result, narrowly losing out to Mic as he put down a Cracking time of 34.43 in his 127. Now that's close racing! Mic strikes back, and 6 more events ahead shaping up to be an epic battle to the title.

Mic & I made a gentleman's agreement to sit out rounds 4 & 5, as Kempsey & Grafton are both a pretty long way to drive for what is ultimately a few minutes of motorsport. Unfortunately, little did we know the spicy cough would make a dramatic return to 2021, and every event yet to run in the championship calendar would ultimately be cancelled one after the other. With the final round in the ACT being cancelled long before it was due to run, the committee called the championship after only 5 rounds. Not what anyone wanted, but noting more could be done.

A well-equipped sporting saloon has received a minor facelift, increased wheelbase and slightly more power.

## FIAT 1500 Mk III

MODERN techniques being what they are, a four cylinder engine of around one and a half litres capacity can be ideally suited to use in a four-five passenger family saloon.

Adequate power development without too great a petrol thirst is possible, and in most respects the car so powered demands few sacrifices of its owner when compared with a larger model and, in fact, it offers numerous advantages.

Technical refinements in steering gear, brakes, suspension and other departments combine with the new engines to make this so.

The Fiat 1500 was one of these "new concept" family saloons and will convey in its latest form four people comfortably and safely at speeds up to 90 miles per hour and within an average fuel consumption of one gallon every 29 miles.

Stylewise the "1500" is good looking. "Boxy" at first glance, it gradually takes on an attractive outline as one becomes more familar with it. The "nose" is short, but this is no disadvantage when parking is considered, and the tail is squared off.

Fit and finish of all panels is good, and the flush-fitting door handles soundly conceived.

Because they rarely occur on small cars, four headlights seem to overburden the front end, but the entire fore and aft styling is adapted to accept them and, considering their usefulness, they are a wise addition.

Construction is of the chassis-less variety and the unit gives an impression of strength. The great depth of the rearmost panel, though necessitating a high lift when loading luggage into the trunk, would add materially to rigidity.

Luggage capacity is 12 cubic feet, the trunk's floor is flat, and the spare wheel fits below the floor, requiring the removal of luggage before it can be taken out.

The engine castings are cleanly executed and the intake and exhaust parts positioned on opposite sides of the cylinder head. Engine accessibility for servicing is good, with the starter motor and generator the most difficult items to get at. Fiat's attention to oil filtering is evidenced by the incorporation of no less than three filters in the lubrication system — a screen filter, paper-cartridge filter and centrifugal filter. Thus protected, the journals of the three-bearing crankshaft and other moving parts should enjoy longevity. The bonnet is hinged at the front for safety and lights provided for night inspections.

Ground clearance is barely five inches, and the sump is in a vulnerable position. Other nether protrusions are the exhaust

pipe and the lower mountings of the rear shock-absorbers.

Interior appointments are endless in the beautifully finished body, which accommodates four adults in luxurious comfort. There is room for a third person in the rear if need be. Each of the four door trims includes a map pocket and an armrest-cum-door-pull, below which is the inside door handle. Ashtrays are provided in both rear doors and the door locks are of the push button type.

Head, leg and knee room are adequate all round, and the individual reclining front seats give plenty of support as well as being adjustable to almost any reasonable requirement. Fore and aft travel is seven inches. Floor coverings are rubber, front and carpet, rear. The large glass area permits panoramic vision, and a driver's only grouches could be "too many controls" and the siting of the handbrake at the left of the transmission hump.

Padding on top and bottom rims of the slightly dished fascia is matt black to discourage reflections, and the instruments are directly ahead of the driver. These comprise ribbon-type speedometer with trip, tenths and aggregate miles, fuel gauge, water temperature gauge and warning lights for a multitude of items from headlamp high-beam to handbrake application.

Though not a sports car, the 1500 possesses a liveliness that could certainly

cause it to be mistaken for a sports saloon. Forty, fifty and sixty miles per hour from a standing start came up with startling suddenness.

Cruising speed is 75 to 80 m.p.h. and noise level moderate at high speeds. Top gear can be used down to 15 m.p.h. without embarrassing shudder and the engine supplies sufficient power for 30 m.p.h. passing in that ratio. The gearbox incorporates synchromesh on all forward gears and the change mechanism is delightfully positive.

A trifle heavy when parking, the steering becomes pleasantly light on the move and is quite direct.

Roadholding is excellent except in the wet, and the cornering characteristic initially neutral, but changing to considerable oversteer when provoked.

The suspension, as with much of the 1500, is of conventional design, independent by high coil springs at the front and normal semi-elliptic leaf springs at the rear. Stabilisers are fitted front and rear, as are telescopic hydraulic shockabsorbers. The result is a soft highway ride, good stability and a smoothing out of back-road bumps. Servo-assisted Girling discs at the front and drums at the rear provide a balanced braking system, which answers the needs generated by the car's inherent high performance. Fading is absent.

#### CLASSIC VEHICLE SCHEME (CVS)

#### Things have changed, so PLEASE read this.

For Club registrars - How to handle NEW classic vehicle scheme applications.

Now that CMC has become an approved organisation (AO) for CVS registrations, your club members require stamps and signatures from the CMC, not ACMC NSW LTD any longer.

The applicant should fill in sections 1 and 2 of the Classic Vehicle Declaration (Transport NSW No. 1835).

Please do not fill in or sign section 3 of that form.

This is for the CMC to fill in and sign as we are your approved organisation and the authorised person.

The primary club, i.e., your club, should simply stamp the lower right hand box to signify that the applicant is a bona fide member of your club, and his or her vehicle is acceptable to your club.

Without that stamp, we will not process the application. The stamp should be legible for all to read, as Transport NSW is very strict on such things.

Transport NSW insist that to start off CVS, an AUVIS or Unregistered Vehicle Inspection Report (blue slip), must be obtained for the vehicle, no matter what registration the vehicle is currently on. This isn't our rule, it comes from Transport NSW, and you should note that not all authorised inspection stations (AIS) can do these.

When any of your fellow club members wish to register their vehicles on the CVS, please ask them NOT to send us the original of the AUVIS or blue slip. A photocopy is sufficient for our records.

This avoids the relatively expensive document going astray in the mail. Note also that they only last for 42 days, so promptness is required.

All we need is the Classic Vehicle Declaration (No. 1835) filled in as above, a copy of the blue slip and the payment. The fee is \$25.00 for the processing, and included in that is a domestic letter with tracking envelope for return to the member. This then gives us a way to find documents should they go astray.

We will no longer be providing express post envelopes as they are expensive, and there isn't a guarantee of the speed of that service anymore.

You can pay the \$25.00 fee by cheque or money order made payable to CMC CVS, or you can EFT the funds to

Please identify the payment in the reference field with a surname <u>and</u> initials.

It would be wise to save this document and discard all others about CVS to avoid mix ups.
