


2022 AROCA 12 Hour Regularity, Winton Raceway

1st-2nd October 2022 (by Martin Gallard, Photos; Warren Smith)

After a three year wait, the 2022 AROCA 12 Hour Regularity at Winton Raceway was a well overdue weekend for our FCNSW competitors. We had not even left Sydney yet before lain Shannon had to withdraw from the event with a car issue at the last minute, and then the two tow vehicles for Andrew & Justin Matthews both ran into strife on the Friday drive. Luckily the McFiat Super Swift was registered, and Justin was able to drive it to Winton whilst arrangements were made to get it back to Sydney after the event. Fortunately, our other drivers Glenn Smith, Michael McGeorge and myself made it there with no issue.

We were very lucky to arrive on Friday afternoon at Winton Raceway to find that despite a Test & Tune day being run, our team garage was available for us to move into straight away. With all cars ready for action we took turns to cycle through the scrutineering bay, with very minimal issue for all cars. All cars signed off and stickered up, nothing left to do but some strategy talk ahead of Saturday event proper.

For those of you that are new to a regularity, here is how it works in 25 words or less. Each team has a minimum/maximum number of drivers and cars. Each team has a maximum amount of time any one driver can be on track over the 12 hours of the event. We are given a qualifying period on Saturday where each driver will perform a set number of laps to establish a base time, and then after a journey



back to the pits to check over tyres etc., will go back out on track to confirm their nominated lap time for the event. Each team is allowed one driver on track at a time, and the team sash/Velcro tab is changed over during a pit stop when one driver/car combination hands over to the next.

At the conclusion of qualifying, the team must nominate a set lap time for each of its drivers. As an example, I nominated 1:54.000 sec. If I was able to lap between 1:54.000 & 1:54.999 sec, my lap counts as two laps as I receive a bonus lap for achieving my set time. Any lap slower than 1:54.999 is counted as one lap, but any lap faster than 1:54.000 is not counted at all. The aim is to be as precise as possible, even through traffic. You are not allowed any timing equipment in your car. All information is passed on to the driver via a pit board, where you are given information as to how close your are to your nominated time.

After 12 hours, the team with the greatest amount of laps is the winner!

We had a huge team of helpers this year, Rick & Brad Andrews, Russel, Savannah Coen, Lauren McNamara, Warren Smith, Roger Malcolm, Kevin & Susan Halliburton, Naomi & Travis McGeorge & Rebecca Gallard all helped out with everything from pit stops, lap timing, spinning spanners, meals, photography, and pretty much anything else we needed. Naomi kept us fed like kings, and Travis was fantastic on the pit wall relaying times to us! Our court jesters Hayley, Abbie & Ella also helped with driver

motivation and entertainment.

Roger Malcolm was one of many helpers at the event for this year.

time. Consistent as always, his efforts put us into a great place so early on. Andrew Matthews was next on track, and built on his experience in the 500. Andrew has been a helper for the team for several years, so when he indicated he wanted to step up and drive, it was great for us to finally get him behind the wheel!

All cars were qualifying well on Saturday morning until the Swift encountered an overheating problem. Despite several attempts to find an issue, the car was put aside for the meantime as the Saturday race would be for 5 hours run before the event is halted on Saturday evening to recommence for the remaining 7 hours to run on Sunday.

Glenn started in the Abarth 124, and put down a huge amount of laps close to his nominated

I was ready to go in my 127 when the driving duties were handed over, but within a lap or two of being out there my car began to behave very strangely. By lap 6 I had lost all drive, and was able to roll to the pits in 4th gear. Once pitted, Mic hit the track in his 127 whilst I jumped under mine to see what the issue was. Somewhere along the way my hub had lost the nut connecting it to the drive shaft, and in

the end the hub snapped clean in half leaving the drive shaft spinning free inside the wheel. Luckily my calliper held disk in place, holding the wheel to the car. Where the hell was I going to get a replacement hub?

Mic was on fire on track, and put down a stack of laps in the afternoon as Glenn and Andrew again shared track time whilst Justin & I worked through our mechanical gremlins. As an incredible stroke of luck, our good friends from FCCVIC in the next garage were able to arrange a replacement hub to come up from Melbourne, which would be to the track early Sunday morning. With this issue partially resolved, all attention went back to the Swift. Justin, Andrew, Rick

With a faulty thermostat deemed to be the issue, the decision was made to retire the car from the event as this part was too hard to replace in time. Glenn again hit the track in the 124 to put down some solid laps, whilst I set to work on putting the 127 back together with all parts now received. Again, a huge thanks to Paul Freame and the FCCVIC team for helping me out! With the car running, I jumped second into line for a quick run to make sure everything was all ok. With the lap times good, I stayed out for 30 minutes, which I would say was a fairly good shakedown of the new parts. Andrew back on track, we were back in action.

Mic went out a little later for his first session, but an issue with his hydraulic clutch cylinder had him come in much earlier than expected. Luckily, we always have a driver in car and in garage ready when a car is on track. Justin had jumped into Glenn's 124 for a session, which was a real struggle to drive slow enough as his nominated lap time was for the Swift. Ever the professional, and brought the car back in one piece after a perfect stint. He later did a session in the 500, which was much closer to drive to his nominated time. Mic was able to repair his clutch, and

between the repaired McFiat 127, my 127, the 124 and 500 we finished out the day as a team with Glenn crossing the line for the checkered flag. 17th Outright, with the two FCCVIC teams coming in 18th and 19th. A great way to wrap up the weekend with our great friends from across the border.

From here it was back to the hotel for a BBQ dinner, a football grand final, and a slice of birthday cake thanks to Rebecca.

I really need to take the time to thank Michael & Naomi McGeorge for the effort they put into the weekend. Far beyond just being the team manager, every aspect of the weekend was locked in and organised to perfection. Thank you from all the team for the amount of effort put in from both of you!



On the 10th December 2022, CIAO will be hosting an exciting All Italian event - "Lago di Mac – Lap of the Lake".

The FIAT Club and its members are invited to attend, and in addition, the invitation is extended to any members to display their machines on the grass by the gorgeous shores of Lake Macquarie. A little more about this Inaugural event:

Thomas H Halton Park will be the epicentre for this cultural festival and will be transformed in a memorable hub of elevated family friendly atmosphere.

From 9am-3pm, it will showcase local Italian business and produce from coffee, food, & artisan stalls, music (already secured an internationally classical trained Italian guitarist), an Antipasto and Aperol Spritzer Piazza with wine and cocktails, grass games for kids and families to enjoy, as well as a Christmas themed Buon Natale photo zone.

For those that don't pack a picnic blanket there will be a large Hamptons marquee with traditional long tables for people to enjoy food and shaded atmosphere from the summer sun. 
